"We Hongkongers" Rolling Survey

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Background

"We Hongkongers" was advocated by Hong Kong Public Opinion Program (HKPOP) of the Hong Kong Public Opinion Research Institute (HKPORI), with the support of many members of the civic society. With reference to the petition website "We the People" hosted by the White House of the United States, "We Hongkongers" aims to reflect public sentiment by conducting scientific research on any issues raised by Hong Kong citizens. If any person can mobilize more than 10,000 "petitions", his or her suggested questions would be included in the survey after verification. The rolling survey of "We Hongkongers" started officially on 17 October 2019, with a target sample size of at least 334 per rolling day. Report No.6 (this report) covers the survey period of 7 to 14 November 2019, and the following 8 questions have completed at least one rolling point with three or four consecutive rolling days of fieldwork within the period mentioned:

- Q1: How much do you support or oppose the setting up of a statutory independent commission of inquiry by the government to look into the use of force by the Police Force in the anti-extradition law incidents?
- Q1: How much do you support or oppose people injured in Prince Edward station on August 31 taking civil action against the Police Force?
- Q2: How much do you support or oppose suspending the duties of police officers who allegedly neglected their duties in the 7.21 incident?
- Q3: How much do you support or oppose setting up smart lampposts with video recording function in various districts in Hong Kong?
- Q4: How much do you support or oppose the setting up of a statutory independent commission of inquiry by the government to look into the use of force by the Police Force in the anti-extradition law incidents?
- Q5: There are views that some undercover police officers have practiced or have instigated others to practice illegal destructive activities. How much do you agree or disagree with this view?
- Q6: Violence continues to escalate in the society. To what extent do you think the SAR Government need to bear the responsibility?
- Q7: Violence continues to escalate in the society. To what extent do you think the Police Force need to bear the responsibility?
- Q8: Violence continues to escalate in the society. To what extent do you think the protesters need to bear the responsibility?

Among these questions, Q6 to Q8 are preliminary findings. The survey will continue until each question reaches the sample size of 1,000 or above.

^[1] Before September 2017, "overall response rate" was used to report surveys' contact information. Starting from September 2017, "effective response rate" was used. In July 2018, POP further revised the calculation of effective response rate. Thus, the response rates before and after the change cannot be directly compared.

^[2] All error figures in this release are calculated at 95% confidence level, meaning that if we were to repeat a certain survey 100 times with different random samples, we would expect 95 times having the population parameter within the respective error margins calculated. Because of sampling errors, when quoting percentages, journalists should refrain from reporting decimal places, whereas one decimal place can be used when quoting rating figures.
