- Date of survey: 21-25/3/2022
- Survey method: Random telephone survey conducted by real interviewers
- Target population: Cantonese-speaking Hong Kong residents aged 18 or above
- Sample size: 1,004(including 503 landline and 501 mobile samples)
- Effective response rate: 42.1%
- Sampling error: Sampling error of percentages not more than +/-4%, that of net values not more than +/-8% and that of ratings not more than +/-0.2 at 95% conf. level
- Weighting method: Rim-weighted according to figures provided by the Census and Statistics Department. The gender-age distribution of the Hong Kong population came from "Mid-year population for 2020", while the educational attainment (highest level attended) distribution and economic activity status distribution came from "Women and Men in Hong Kong Key Statistics (2020 Edition)".




[•] Results of our news media survey show that 65% and 64% of the respondents claimed their main sources of news were television and internet respectively. Besides, 21% respectively said their main sources of news were newspapers and radio. The former has dropped significantly and registered another all-time low since record began in 1993.

• As for trustworthiness, 35% and 24% of the respondents respectively found television and internet to be the most trustworthy source of news. The former has risen significantly compared to half a year ago. The trustworthiness of newspapers has dropped to 8%, registering an all-time low since record began in 1993.





- The net satisfactions toward internet has significantly dropped by 10 percentage points compared to one year ago, registering an all-time record low since 2010. The net satisfactions toward television has significantly risen by 9 percentage points, registering a record high since 2018.
- Overall speaking, people's satisfaction with the performance of news media in general continues to plunge. The latest satisfaction rate is 33%, net satisfaction at positive 2 percentage points, registering an all-time low since record began in 1993.



- Results also show that 28% of the respondents were satisfied with the freedom of the press in Hong Kong while 51% were dissatisfied, giving a net satisfaction of negative 23 percentage points.
- On a scale of 0-10, the credibility rating of the Hong Kong news media is 4.94 marks.

- o 22% perceived the local news media to be responsible in their reporting, 42% regarded the local news media as irresponsible, giving a net value of negative 20 percentage points, which has dropped by 8% compared to half year ago, registering a record low since 2006.
- In addition, 48% of the respondents thought the local news media had practiced self-censorship while 31% perceived the opposite, giving a net value of positive 17 percentage points.

o 63% thought the local news media had scruples when criticizing the Central Government, with a net value of positive 40 percentage points. 51% thought they had scruples when criticizing the HKSAR Government, net value at positive 11 percentage points, a plunge of 13 percentage points since March last year.

o 43% believed the local news media had given full play to the freedom of speech, net value at negative 3 percentage points, an all-time low since record began in 1997. But at the same time, 49% said they had misused or abused the freedom of press, net value at positive 12 percentage points.
