香港民研發放立法會議員民望、台灣及西藏問題調查結果

特別宣佈

香港民意研究所(香港民研)前身為香港大學民意研究計劃(港大民研)。公報內的「香港民研」指的可以是香港民意研究所或其前身港大民研。

由 2022 年 5 月開始,香港民研將主要透過新聞公報發放調查數據,而發佈會的次數將大幅減少,敬請留意。同時,香港民研想藉此重申,我們研究的核心價值是科學與民主,並向來以專業知識和社會良知服務大眾。我們一直強調專業中立,而評論責任應由論者自負,與香港民研無關。

公報簡要

香港民研於四月由真實訪問員以隨機抽樣電話訪問方式,分兩階段成功訪問了 1,014 和 1,001 名香港居民。調查顯示,6 位最多人認識的立法會議員分別是李慧琼、葉劉淑儀、何君堯、田北辰、梁美芬和周浩鼎,支持度排首位是田北辰,得 50.9 分。第二至三位是葉劉淑儀和李慧琼,分別得 47.7 及 43.7 分。然後是梁美芬和何君堯,分別得 42.7 及 35.8 分。而周浩鼎得 38.0 分,但由於認知率較低而被剔除。田北辰、葉劉淑儀、李慧琼及梁美芬的評分均較上次調查顯著上升,當中田北辰及葉劉淑儀的評分創 2019 年 3 月以來新高,李慧琼及梁美芬的評分則分別創 2018 年 7 月及 2017 年 11 月以來新高。台灣及西藏問題方面,香港市民對兩岸統一有信心的淨值為負 4 個百分點,再創 2012 年以來新高。國際空間方面,台灣重新加入聯合國的贊成淨值少於正 1 個百分點,再創 2011 年以來新低。另外,認為「一國兩制」適用於台灣的淨值為負 12 個百分點,創 2017 年以來新高。台灣獨立方面,贊成淨值為負 35 個百分點,創 2017 年以來新低。至於西藏問題方面,贊成西藏獨立的淨值為負 42 個百分點,創 2018 年以來新低。 議員評分及台灣西藏問題調查的實效回應比率為 47.6%。在 95%置信水平下,調查的百分比誤差不超過+/-4%,淨值誤差不超過+/-7%,評分誤差不超過+/-2.8。

[2] 此公報中所有誤差數字均以 95%置信水平計算。95%置信水平,是指倘若以不同隨機樣本重複進行有關調查 100 次,則 95 次各自計算出的誤差範圍會包含人口真實數字。由於調查數字涉及抽樣誤差,傳媒引用百分比 數字時,應避免使用小數點,在引用評分數字時,則可以使用一個小數點。

立法會議員民望

在提名調查中,被訪者可在未經提示下說出最多 10 名最熟悉的議員,結果首 6 位最多被訪者提及的議員分別是李慧琼、葉劉淑儀、何君堯、田北辰、梁美芬和周浩鼎,他們於是被納入評分調查。在評分調查中,被訪者就個別議員以 0 至 100 分進行評分,0 分代表絕對不支持,100 分代表絕對支持,50 分為一半半。統計結果後,認知度最低的再被剔除,之後再按支持度由高至低順序排列,得出五大立法會議員。以下是五大立法會議員的最新評分,按評分高至低排列[3]:

最新調查顯示,市民對立法會議員的最新支持度排名,首位是田北辰,得 50.9 分。第二至三位是葉劉淑儀和李慧琼,分別得 47.7 及 43.7 分。然後是梁美芬和何君堯,分別得 42.7 及 35.8

分。而周浩鼎得 38.0 分,但由於認知率較低而被剔除。田北辰、葉劉淑儀、李慧琼及梁美芬的評分均較上次調查顯著上升,當中田北辰及葉劉淑儀的評分創 2019 年 3 月以來新高,李慧琼及梁美芬的評分則分別創 2018 年 7 月及 2017 年 11 月以來新高。

須要說明,躋身「五大議員」的先決條件是市民的熟悉程度,然後再按支持度排名。「五大」 以外的議員,支持度可以很高或很低,但由於並非市民最熟悉的議員,所以不在榜內。

最新調查顯示,38%被訪的香港市民表示對兩岸統一有信心,42%表示沒有信心,信心淨值為負4個百分點,再創2012年以來新高。國際空間方面,贊成和反對台灣重新加入聯合國的各佔38%,贊成淨值再創2011年以來新低。另外,33%認為「一國兩制」適用於台灣,認為不適用的佔45%,適用淨值為負12個百分點,創2017年以來新高。台灣獨立方面,22%表示贊成,反對的佔57%,贊成淨值為負35個百分點,創2017年以來新低。至於西藏問題方面,59%被訪的香港市民反對西藏獨立,贊成者佔17%,贊成淨值為負42個百分點,創2018年以來新低。

民意日誌

香港民研於 2007 年開始與慧科訊業有限公司合作,由慧科訊業按照香港民研設計的分析方法,將每日大事紀錄傳送至香港民研,經香港民研核實後成為「民意日誌」。

由於本新聞公報所涉及的部份調查項目,上次調查日期為 4-7/10/2021,而今次調查日期則為 19-22/4/2022,因此是次公報中的「民意日誌」項目便以上述日期為依歸,讓讀者作出比較。 以涵蓋率不下 25%本地報章每日頭條新聞和報社評論計,在上述期間發生的相關大事包括以下事件,讀者可以自行判斷有關事件有否影響各項民調數字:

PORI releases popularity of Legislative Councillors and survey results on Taiwan and Tibetan issues

Special Announcements

The predecessor of Hong Kong Public Opinion Research Institute (HKPORI) was The Public Opinion Programme at The University of Hong Kong (HKUPOP). "PORI" in this release can refer to Hong Kong Public Opinion Research Institute or its predecessor HKUPOP.

Starting from May 2022, HKPORI will mainly release survey findings through press releases, and the number of press conferences will be significantly reduced. Meanwhile, we would like to reiterate that HKPORI adheres to its core values of science and democracy, and serves the world with the best of its professional knowledge and social conscience. We have always emphasized professional neutrality and the responsibility of all personal comments should lie entirely on the commentator(s) concerned, not HKPORI.

Abstract

PORI successfully interviewed 1,014 and 1,001 Hong Kong residents respectively by random telephone surveys conducted by real interviewers in April. Our survey shows that Starry Lee, Regina Ip, Junius Ho, Michael Tien, Priscilla Leung and Holden Chow are the six Legislative Councillors that top people's mind now. In terms of rating, Michael Tien tops the list with 50.9 marks. Regina Ip and Starry Lee rank the 2nd and 3rd with 47.7 and 43.7 marks respectively. Priscilla Leung and Junius Ho follow with 42.7 and 35.8 marks respectively, whereas Holden Chow obtains a rating of 38.0 marks, but is dropped due to his relatively low recognition rate. The ratings of Michael Tien, Regina Ip, Starry Lee and Priscilla Leung have increased significantly compared with the last survey. Among them, that of Michael Tien and Regina Ip have registered record highs since March 2019, while that of Starry Lee and Priscilla Leung have registered record highs since July 2018 and November 2017 respectively. Regarding Taiwan and Tibetan issues, Hong Kong people's net confidence in the ultimate reunification across the strait stands at negative 4 percentage points, which has registered another record high since 2012. Regarding international space, net support in Taiwan's rejoining the United Nations is less than positive 1 percentage point, which has registered a new record low since 2011. Meanwhile, net value in believing "one country, two systems" was applicable to Taiwan stands at negative 12 percentage points, registering a record high since 2017. As for the independence of Taiwan, net support stands at negative 35 percentage points, which has registered a record low since 2017. Regarding Tibetan issues, net support in the independence of Tibet stands at negative 42 percentage points, which has registered a record low since 2018. The effective response rate of survey on the councillors' ratings and Taiwan and Tibetan issues is 47.6%. The maximum sampling error of percentages is +/-4%, that of net values is +/-7% and that of ratings is +/-2.8 at 95% confidence level.

Popularity of Legislative Councillors

In the naming survey, respondents could name, unprompted, up to 10 councillors whom they knew best. Starry Lee, Regina Ip, Junius Ho, Michael Tien, Priscilla Leung and Holden Chow were the top 6 councillors being mentioned most frequently, they therefore entered the rating survey. In the rating survey, respondents were asked to rate individual councillors using a 0-100 scale, where 0 indicates absolutely no support, 100 indicates absolute support and 50 means half-half. After calculation, the bottom councillor in terms of recognition rate was dropped; the remaining 5 were then ranked according to their support ratings to become the top 5 Legislative Councillors. Recent ratings of the top 5 Legislative Councillors are summarized below, in descending order of support ratings^[3]:

The latest survey shows that Michael Tien is the most popularly supported councillor, attaining 50.9 marks. Regina Ip and Starry Lee rank the 2nd and 3rd with 47.7 and 43.7 marks respectively. Priscilla Leung and Junius Ho follow with 42.7 and 35.8 marks respectively, whereas Holden Chow obtains a rating of 38.0 marks, but is dropped due to his relatively low recognition rate. The ratings of Michael Tien, Regina Ip, Starry Lee and Priscilla Leung have increased significantly compared with the last survey. Among them, that of Michael Tien and Regina Ip have registered record highs since March 2019, while that of Starry Lee and Priscilla Leung have registered record highs since July 2018 and November 2017 respectively.

It should be noted, however, that our list of "top 5" only includes LegCo members who are best known to the public, ranked according to their support ratings. Other councillors may well have very high or low support ratings, but because they are relatively less well-known, they are not included in our final list.

Taiwan and Tibetan Issues

People's latest views towards various Taiwan and Tibetan issues are summarized below:

The latest survey reveals that 38% of Hong Kong people interviewed were confident in the ultimate reunification across the strait while 42% expressed no confidence. Net confidence stands at negative 4 percentage points, which has registered another record high since 2012. Regarding international space, the support and opposition of Taiwan's rejoining the United Nations equally accounted for 38%, and the net support registered another record low since 2011. Meanwhile, 33% believed "one country, two systems" was applicable to Taiwan while 45% believed it was not. Net value of applicability stands at negative 12 percentage points, registering a record high since 2017. As for the independence of Taiwan, 22% supported Taiwan's independence while 57% opposed it. Net support stands at negative 35 percentage points, which has registered a record low since 2017. Regarding Tibetan issues, 59% of Hong Kong people interviewed opposed the independence of Tibet whereas 17% showed support. Net support stands at negative 42 percentage points, which has registered a record low since 2018.

Opinion Daily

In 2007, PORI started collaborating with Wisers Information Limited whereby Wisers supplies to PORI a record of significant events of that day according to the research method designed by PORI. These daily entries would then become "Opinion Daily" after they are verified by PORI.

For the polling items covered in this press release, the previous survey was conducted from 4 to 7 October, 2021 while this survey was conducted from 19 to 22 April, 2022. During this period, herewith the significant events selected from counting newspaper headlines and commentaries on a daily basis and covered by at least 25% of the local newspaper articles. Readers can make their own judgment if these significant events have any impacts to different polling figures.
